AUDIENCE CASH AWARD \$100

Awarded at the in-person **Feder Memorial String Competition Awards Ceremony** by the audience from the showcased performances during the ceremony. **Four** awards are given (one for each level of difficulty). For the 2021 competition, Washington Performing Arts will hold an Awards Ceremony only if it is safe to do so.

GOLDIE B. FEDER AWARD \$600

Named in honor of the founder of the Competition to recognize overall achievement and outstanding musicianship.

WASHINGTON PERFORMING ARTS SCHOLARSHIP AWARD \$1,500

Judges may award up to **four** scholarships which may be used toward tuition costs for an approved summer music camp or toward private study with an approved teacher during the current calendar year. Washington Performing Arts will make payments directly to the institution for the summer camp or directly to a private instructor. All scholarships are non-transferable. The award money is forfeited if not utilized by August 30, 2021. Any interruptions to instruction plans due to the COVID-19 Pandemic should be communicated to Washington Performing Arts and will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

BLUE MOUNTAIN MUSIC FESTIVAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD \$400

Blue Mountain Festival (BMF) is providing up to **four** scholarships. When used with the Washington Performing Arts Scholarship Award, the full tuition amount to attend BMF is covered.

***Blue Mountain Festival** is a residential two-week chamber music program for talented young musicians. Students receive 6-8 hours of coaching, teaching, supervised practice and theory class daily. There are five concerts during the course of the festival; two faculty and three student performances. The festival takes place on the campus of Franklin and Marshall College in Lancaster, PA. MISBIN FAMILY MEMORIAL AWARD \$250 CASH PRIZE

A monetary prize named in honor of the Misbin family to recognize musicality by students who demonstrate sensitivity and understanding through their interpretation of the music. Judges may select up to six awards.

MISBIN FAMILY MEMORIAL NEW TALENT AWARD *\$100 CASH PRIZE*

Named in honor of the Misbin Family to recognize talent by new students who show great promise and potential.

WASHINGTON PERFORMING ARTS WOMEN'S COMMITTEE MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP AWARD *\$1,000*

Funded through the generosity of the members of the Washington Performing Arts Women's Committee, this award is to be used to further the music instruction of the recipient as adjudicated in the 50th Annual Feder Memorial String Competition.

TUTORIAL AWARD *\$600*

Judges may award up to **three** Tutorial Awards which **must be applied** toward instruction at either an institution or with a private instructor. Washington Performing Arts may make arrangements with a local music institution for placement with a private instructor (it is possible that institution may require a separate audition). Likewise, the winner of the Tutorial Award may direct that the award be applied toward instruction with a specific private instructor. Washington Performing Arts will make payments directly to the institution or to the private instructor. All awards are non-transferable. The award money is forfeited if it is not used by August 30, 2021.
